

Bushcraft Swedish Log Making – Risk Assessment

The document shows the risk assessment ratings for each identified hazard. The score for the likelihood of its happing is multiplied by the score of the severity of the injury.

(For example, likelihood 2 multiplied by Severity 5 = 10 medium).

This Risk assessment identifies the risk control methods that have been put into place to reduce either the Severity or Likelihood of an accident.
