(3.1) Evaluate the risk of the fire occurring.	Minimal Chance of fire.	
(3.2) Evaluate the Risk to people from a fire starting on the premises.	Little risk to staff or visitors as the pods are away from shelter location where risk is slightly higher. Smoke alarms, mains supplied, with battery backup in each pod. Fire extinguishers and fire blanket found in box attached to 3 bar fence in pod village. No Wheelchair access to the pods. Campfires located far enough away to not consider being a risk. Electrical inspections undertaken, Village rules and policies in place. Single fire exit from each pod with fire door rated for 30 minutes.	
(3.3) Remove and reduce the hazards that may cause a fire.	Keep all Fire sources clear from combustible materials, Keep Fire exits clear. Follow site rules and policies and their own policies for use of cooking equipment.	
(3.4) Remove and Reduce the risks to people from a fire.	Pod villages have fire extinguishers or equivalent checks on annual basis, along with the weekly fire checks of fire alarms, extinguishers and fire blankets. Fire action plan in place.
