

Walton Firs Activity Centre is an award-winning and popular provider of outdoor education services for young people. Based in central Surrey, we work with a wide range of children's, youth and education service providers, to offer young people opportunities to learn in the outdoor environment. With our consistently high levels of customer satisfaction ratings over the past year, we're going places and are looking for people who share our passion for outdoor and environmental education. If you want to be a part of our journey towards excellence, then we want to hear from you!

The Organisation:

Walton Firs Activity Centre is an independent outdoor education provider that delivers outdoor education services and residential programmes for young people aged between 5 and 18. Established in 2008, the activity centre recently received *The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service* in recognition of our longstanding commitment to young and community volunteers.

In 2020/21, we engaged 22,500 young people, delivered 35,000 activity places, and worked with 450 service providers from across Surrey, London, and the home counties. We were supported by more than 60 volunteers to support the delivery and maintenance of our services, including 6 volunteer service crews.

Alongside our reputation for high quality services, our proximity to the A3 and M25 enables us to work with an extensive range of service commissioners from across the south-east of England, with the vast majority returning to us year after year. Using our 36-acre woodland site in Cobham, we offer twenty-five land-based outdoor activities, and residential camping and accommodation facilities for uniformed and informal youth service providers, and primary, secondary and SEND education providers. The activity centre is owned and managed by the Walton Firs Foundation, a charity with a mission to enable young people's personal development through participation in outdoor education.

The Job:

Walton Firs Activity Centre is staffed by a committed and growing team of staff. We've recently restructured our staff into three operational teams including a new Programmes Team, which consists of six full-time and ten part-time outdoor activities instructors. The team members are supervised and directed by our Deputy Activity Centre Manager / Programmes Manager. We've chosen to employ most of our full-time Programmes Team posts on a permanent basis, as we want to recruit, train and retain the best quality employees for the long-term. For the chosen appointees, we will make significant investments in your professional development and give you opportunities to build your experience and achieve additional qualifications.

The Programmes Team is responsible to ensure the effective design, preparation, maintenance, delivery and development of the activity centre's specialist outdoor education facilities and equipment, and its public-facing programme offer. The team aims to deliver a 100% safety record and customer satisfaction rates in relation to our outdoor education programme offer.

The outdoor activities instructors deliver three sets of accountabilities within the delivery of the activity centre's services and programmes. The first accountability relates to the delivery of the activity centre's outdoor education programmes. The second accountability relates to the delivery of a range of planned and reactive maintenance of the activity centre site's activity facilities and wider buildings and site. The third accountability relates to the support of the activity centre's volunteer programmes, which include internal service crews, educational, youth work and corporate volunteer groups, and individual work experience placements for vulnerable young people.

We're looking to appoint four committed, experienced and skilled outdoor activities instructors, who have a proven track-record for the delivery of high-quality outdoor education services for young people. You will be an enthusiastic, flexible, and 'young people-friendly' individual who enjoys working in an outdoor setting, and who has a proven ability to deliver group-based informal learning processes. You'll be an effective team-player, who can work cooperatively with colleagues and stakeholders at all levels of the organisation. You'll have a relevant range of outdoor education qualifications and accreditations, and will be happy to undertake further training in your specialist field. You'll have a proven track record for delivering the highest standards of customer service and support. You'll have an absolute commitment to the management of safety, and be able to undertake scheduled equipment checks and deliver reactive maintenance activities. You'll hold, or be willing to undertake, a current and satisfactory Enhanced DBS Certificate. Finally, you'll be willing and able to work flexible hours in response to service delivery demands, including weekday evenings, weekends and periodic bank holidays and overnight duty officer accountabilities.

B. Job Description

Job Purpose:

To deliver and maintain a range of outdoor education programmes at Walton Firs Activity Centre, that enable children and young people's learning, personal development and appreciation of the natural environment.

Key accountabilities include:

1. Service User Engagement:

1.1 To receive, induct and provide ongoing support to groups of children and young people, ensuring their understanding of the activity centre's operational arrangements and safety procedures, and enabling their positive engagement in the services delivered.

2. Outdoor Activities Instruction:

- 2.1 To deliver a range of outdoor education activities and programmes to groups of children and young people, ensuring their safety and wellbeing whilst participating in the activities.
- 2.2 To deliver a range of outdoor education activities and programmes to groups of children and young people, ensuring their informal learning and personal development through participating in the activities.
- 2.3 To develop new areas of activity centre outdoor education programming, as agreed with management.

3. Outdoor Activity Facilities Maintenance:

- 3.1 To contribute to the planned inspections, maintenance and cleaning of outdoor education facilities and venues, ensuring compliance to all required health and safety standards, governing body-related and activity centre policy requirements.
- 3.2 To contribute to the reactive maintenance, repairs and cleaning of outdoor education facilities and venues, ensuring compliance to all required health and safety standards, governing body-related and activity centre policy requirements.

4. Outdoor Activity Equipment Maintenance:

- 4.1 To contribute to the planned inspections, maintenance, and cleaning of outdoor education equipment and materials, ensuring compliance to all required health and safety standards, governing body-related and activity centre policy requirements.
- 4.2 To contribute to the reactive maintenance and repairs of outdoor education equipment and materials, ensuring compliance to all required health and safety standards, governing body-related and activity centre policy requirements.

5. Outdoor Activity Premises Maintenance:

- 5.1 To contribute to the planned inspections and maintenance of on-site premises and ancillary facilities, ensuring compliance to all required health and safety standards and activity centre policy requirements.
- 5.2 To contribute to the reactive maintenance and repairs of site premises and ancillary facilities, ensuring compliance to all required health and safety standards and activity centre policy requirements.

6. Volunteer Engagement:

6.1 To contribute to the delivery of activity centre volunteering programmes, and the support of volunteer groups and individual volunteers.

7. Any Other Duties:

- 7.1 To undertake periodic overnight duty officer responsibilities, in conjunction with other members of the activity centre staff team.
- 7.2 To attend activity centre staff meetings, supervisory meetings and workforce development activities, as required to maintain and develop effective public-facing services.
- 7.3 To deliver effective standards of customer service and care to activity centre users, visitors and volunteers.

- 7.4 To support the development and maintenance of a 'safety culture' within the activity centre, and ensure the effective management of health and safety-related practices, policies and procedures, as a member of the activity centre staff team.
- 7.5 To support the development and maintenance of an 'accountability culture' within the activity centre, and ensure the effective management of the activity centre site, premises, facilities, equipment and resources, as a member of the activity centre staff team.
- 7.6 To undertake any other duties or accountabilities commensurate with the grade of the post, as required to maintain effective public-facing services.
