Low Ropes

Over the winter months, we have constructed a new Low Ropes course, consisting of different elements which the participants will need to overcome to complete the activity. These include a giant see-saw, a '4 – way', Mo-hawk and trail. This new activity will be an instructed session and available for visitors aged seven and over, due to the strength required to complete the course.

The course itself sits just one metre off the floor and is designed to develop team work, balance and coordination as well as trust in other people - whilst allowing participants to have fun at the same time. The low ropes course could also help visitors gain in confidence before approaching some of the other higher activities at the centre.

Nightline Revamped



Due to the construction of the low ropes course, we have moved and improved the Nightline course. The new course which is over 120 meters in length and has more elements for the participants to complete (e.g. dangling ropes, spiders web, 'through the key hole' and a cargo net crawl).



The overall purpose of the nightline course is to make participants use different senses and teamwork as they navigate through the course.

The course will remain a selfled activity and have a useful information sheet for leaders to get the most from it.

We hope to further extend the course, so if you know of anyone with a large plastic tube going spare (1 metre diameter & between 3 and 6 metres in length) please let us know!



The New Ablutions

The new toilet block at Walton Firs completed in June last year. Since then the construction of the water fountain and the pathways outside the toilet block have been completed by staff and volunteers.

Within the pathway around the toilet block a special paving slab has been set which displays the various compass points.

This area has also seen the erection of fences for both aesthetics and safety reasons, and we plan to build an outside shower over the coming months for use after the adventure course or any muddy activities.

Expanding Walton Firs

Walton Firs has leased an additional parcel of land from our neighbours on the Burhill Estate. The land is located behind the Adventure Course and extends from the Horse Field up towards the Seven Hills Road. The land will be cleared to allow the Centre to move the Archery range and offer additional activity space for schools and youth groups visiting the site.

We potentially have a generous offer of a JCB to help clear the land, but we have a great deal of chainsaw work to do first so that the JCB can access the more overgrown areas.

If you hold a chainsaw certificate of competence, and would like to come and assist in the clearance the please do get in touch. But it's not just chainsaw teams we need - If you would like to volunteer any kind of assistance to help clear the land then please let us know. There will be a great deal on hands-on assistance required. Discounted camping rates may be available to certain youthful categories of helpers!

The JCB (if procured) will be on-site after Easter, so we are especially keen to hear from individuals or teams that could assist:

Weekends of 1st-2nd April, 8th-9th April or Easter long weekend (14th-18th April).

Weekdays 3rd-7th April or 10th-13th April.
